Notes	
1	A minimum grade of C (2.0) is <u>required</u> in all major courses.
2	A student will complete all lower division core requirements as well as prerequisites by the end of sophomore year.
3	A maximum of 40 upper division units in MDLG courses will be accepted toward degree requirements.
4	30 of the last 36 units must be completed at LMU.
5	Students who need more semester hours to complete the Modern Languages major due to their initial language placement must take additional upper division elective courses in that language concentration. If no upper division elective courses in the language are offered by the Department of Modern Languages and Literature, students may fulfill up to four credits by taking a course offered outside the Department in the appropriate cultural studies area (e.g., ASPA, CLST, HMNT, LBST). Students must have pre-approval from the Modern Languages Program Coordinator and the Department Chair <i>prior</i> to taking a course.
