[3] A maximum of **40 upper division units** in POLS will be accepted toward degree requirements. Minimum upper division POLS is 24 units. Up to two upper division courses from Study Abroad may count towards the

[4] Students who attain a minimum GPA of 3.6, both overall and in the major, are eligible to enroll in POLS 581 Honors Seminar in the fall and to write an Honors Thesis (POLS 591) in the spring of their senior year.

[5] 30 of the last 36 units must be completed at LMU.

[6] Once a student has enrolled at LMU and declared a Political Science major or minor, only LMU course work or courses from an LMU-approved study abroad program will be accepted for the major or minor.

[7] Units for required major course(s) that also meet the core will be counted towards the major. This does not take into consideration a major elective course(s) that may meet both a major and core requirement(s). If two required areas are met by one course, the outstanding units must be met in the Elective units total.

[8] All graduating seniors are required to enroll in POLS 5000 for their final semester. This is a zero-semester-hour course, required for graduation, which includes an assessment of program learning outcomes, a senior exit interview, and possible additional program evaluation.
