[1] Minimum grade of B- (2.7) is required in lower division ECON courses.

[2] A maximum of 48 upper division units in ECON will be accepted toward degree requirements. Upper division courses should be taken at LMU, except by permission.

[3] Minimum grade of B- (2.7) is required in MATH 112. A minimum grade of C (2.0) is required in MATH 131.

[4] The total number of electives required is determined by the lower division ECON and MATH options completed in the major.

[5] This degree is suitable for pre-law students or those interested in careers in education, urban planning, federal, state and local government.

[6] 30 of the last 36 units must be completed at LMU.
