1	A minor in Global Economics cannot be combined with a major in Economics.
2	An average grade of C is required in all courses in the minor.
3	Language proficiency will be assessed via the Modern Languages' online placement tests. Although Level 3 proficiency is the required minimum, we strongly encourage students to continue to more advanced levels.
4	The required information for international internships needs to be provided also in English.
5	The Study Abroad experience must be an LMU or LMU-approved semester or summer program. The summer program must be at least 6 semester hours. This requirement should enhance a student's language skills and cultural awareness that s/he is focused on in courses at LMU. A maximum of one course from study abroad may count towards the minor beyond the study abroad requirement.
6	International students may explore the possibility of having the foreign language and/or international experience waived, in consultation with the Director of the Global Economics Minor and the Department Chair.
