1	A minimum grade of C (2.0) is required in all major courses.
2	FREN 2101 is a pre-requisite for the major. Lower division FREN courses may be waived through the LMU French placement exam and no credit is granted.
3	FREN 4990 is a Senior Capstone and must be completed in the last semester. Guidelines for the portfolio and oral presentation are available from the French coordinator in the Modern Languages and Literatures department.
4	A maximum of 40 units of upper division FREN is applicable to the degree.
5	30 of the last 36 units must be completed at LMU.
6	French courses in lower division (FREN 2102, 2103, 2104) can be waived without credit if students placed in upper division courses in their placement exam. Waived no-credit classes do not have to be made up to complete the French major.
