# bcla uncovered: explore electives!



- general electives: courses that do not count towards core, major, or minor requirements
- your BCLA degree is designed with room for elective courses that can help you explore academic interests
- approx. 1/3 of the 124 minimum units required for degree completion may be fulfilled by taking elective courses
- most BCLA courses do not have prerequisites or major restrictions, so any student can take them
- meet with a BCLA advisor to discuss elective options and ways to incorporate electives into your course plan
