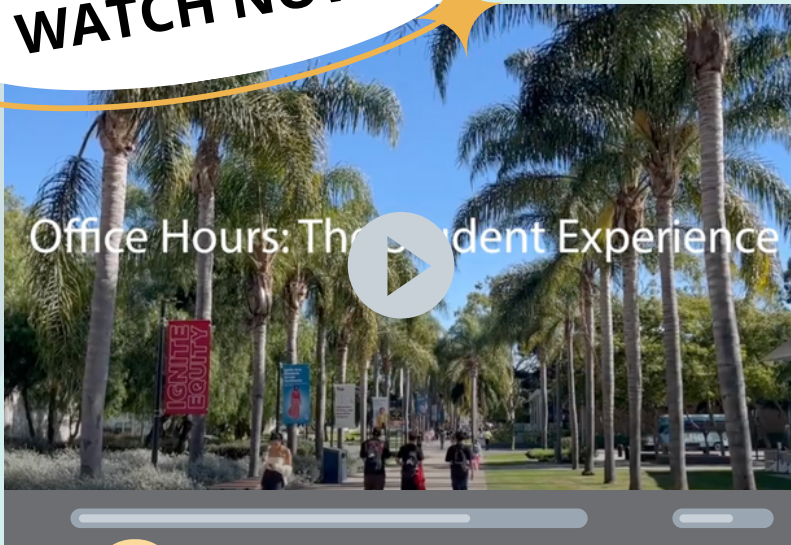

Thinking back to your college experience, how did you decide on your major?

- Attend **Faculty Office Hours** and talk to staff across campus about their areas of expertise, courses they teach, and research interests.
- Mentorship Programs (peer, faculty, and professional) can be great opportunities to discuss academic interests and learn from the experiences of others.
