COURSE DESCRIPTION/PRINCIPAL TOPICS:

Students will study forms, techniques, and conventions of literary, short-form creative writing through writing exercises and discussion of literary work. They will craft, workshop, and revise their own original short-form literary works in four prose genres: poetry and fiction (including hybrid forms), creative nonfiction (memoir and lyric essay), and drama (ten-minute play).

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

As a result of this course, students will:

- Achieve a greater understanding of literary forms and conventions, both as readers and writers, and apply that understanding to their own creative writing.
- Evaluate and analyze the creative process from ideation to the polishing of manuscripts while developing effective personal writing habits.
- Enhance their ability to evaluate and respond critically to their own work and that of others.
- Demonstrate writing competence in short-form prose poetry, fiction, and hybrid forms of both, as well as creative non-fiction (memoir and lyric essay) and the ten-minute play.
