COURSE DESCRIPTION/PRINCIPAL TOPICS:

The Irish poet W. B. Yeats once posed the question, "How can we know the dancer from the dance?" Poetry, like dance, or music, inevitably presents a simultaneous instantiation of art and technique. Using a judicious combination of acquisition of critical terminologies, critical assessment of representative (and often famous) poems, and exercises in constructing one's own poetic expressions, this course will investigate the ways in which poetic technique facilitates poetic art.

- Students will be able to recognize and analyze specific poetic techniques as evidenced in a diverse range of canonical and non-canonical poetry, written across different periods and places
- Students will engage with poetry through a combination of critcal, technical, and creative assignments
