Many of these fifteen award recipients had never studied German before entering our program. The proficiency they gained at LMU helped them obtain the prestigious Fulbright Scholarship.

Nolan Rivkin ('13)

Nolan majored in History and minored in German. He started German at LMU from scratch. He was the Fulbright recipient for the 2013-2014 academic year, and taught English at a German high school near Hamburg. He is now a Ph.D. student in History at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville.
