This course concentrates on further perfecting the student's four communicative skills. It focuses on building more advanced vocabulary, idiomatic expressions, grammatical patterns and expansion of kanji. Students write short essays on selected topics. Each student gives oral presentations, using formal language, especially different levels of Keigo (honorific & humble expressions). Selected topics on Japanese culture are presented throughout the course to enhance students' awareness and understanding of Japanese culture.
